## Trunk Theatre

Year 2 were delighted to have a visit from Trunk Theatre this week, who helped to bring the events of the Great Fire of London to life with great energy and enthusiasm. The shouts and whoops of delight were a pleasure to hear as the children were fully involved in the story, interacting with the main characters to draw water from the River Thames to put out the fire. At the end of the performance the children designed their new version of London on huge paper scrolls rolled out on the floor.



### Blood Soup

The children in Year 6 are currently learning about the circulatory system and have been studying the components of blood. Having researched the four main components of blood: red blood cells, white blood cells, platelets and plasma, the children made their own 'blood soup' using jelly, smarties, marshmallows and apple juice, carefully selecting the right proportion of each component according to their research. ### Room News

This week, at Group Time, we have been talking about feelings. We read the story of 'The Colour Monster' by Anna Llenas, in which the colour monster is feeling all mixed up inside, and so his friend helps him to sort out and identify his different feelings. The children have had some really fantastic discussions about how they are feeling and what makes them feel different emotions. We also talked about different ways we could deal with difficult emotions, such as finding a friend or grown-up if we felt scared, or saying 'Stop' to our friends if they were doing something which made us feel angry.

We looked at a 'feelings fan' to help us identify different feelings and learnt the Makaton signs for each of them. I wonder if your child can sign the words 'happy', 'sad', 'cross/angry' and 'scared/frightened' for you at home? You could also talk about the different feelings you and your child are experiencing at home too. It's a great way to help children begin to learn to regulate their own behaviour and emotions.
