Medical Tracker

As you know the school office staff currently send you an e-mail if your child has received First Aid for a bumped head or other head injury. We have been investigating how we can keep you better informed about all the First Aid treatment your child may receive in school and so I am pleased to inform you that we have purchased a new cloud based system called Medical Tracker. Medical Tracker allows us to inform you every time your child receives First Aid in school or medication is administered. When we return to school after half term you will receive an e-mail each time your child receives First Aid. The e-mails will be sent directly to you by the member of staff who administers the First Aid to your child. These e-mails will be sent from donotreply@medicaltracker.co.uk. Please add this address to your e-mail address book or approved sender list to prevent it being blocked by your SPAM or junk filters. Please be assured that we will continue to telephone you if we feel that you need to collect your child or if we feel you need to seek further medical attention for your child. We hope you will find the Medical Tracker system helpful and informative. If you have any questions about the system please contact us via the school office and we will be happy to discuss the system with you.

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A Message From the Royal Mail

The Royal Mail have asked for our support in raising awareness for their current 'Dog Awareness' campaign.

In 2022/23, 1,916 Royal Mail employees were attacked by dogs whilst delivering mail to our homes. Some of the 'posties' who were injured, suffered permanent and disabling injuries.

Even if dogs are placid they can behave differently if someone they don't know approaches their home or if they are feeling unwell or unsettled. A dog's loyalty and protective nature—the reasons why we love them so much – can mean they aren't always friendly to visitors. Consequently, the Royal Mail is asking us to:


• Secure our dogs behind a gate or in another room before opening the door to accept delivery of a parcel or letter.

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- Make sure side and back gates and doors are closed so that dogs can't get loose.
- Consider fitting an external mail box or letter cage to prevent bites to hands and fingers.

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

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Our Charity of the Year

Following a whole school consultation run by members of the school the children voted to support the British Heart Foundation this year.

February is British Heart Foundation's Heart Month when people are encouraged to go red and fundraise for the charity. We will be doing our bit by hosting a red themed bake sale after the half term break on Wednesday 13th March (further information to follow).

Sadly, many of us will witness a cardiac arrest in our lifetime. The British Heart Foundation is running a brilliant initiative, RevivR, to ensure we are ready if this should happen. RevivR is a fast, free and easy-to-use online training course. In just 15 minutes, you can learn how to save a life and receive your very own CPR certificate. It couldn't be simpler – you just need your mobile phone or tablet and a cushion to practise on.

The training course will:

- teach you how to recognise a cardiac arrest and what to do in an emergency situation
- teach you what to expect with a simulated 999 call
- Help you to practise and perfect your CPR technique
- Teach you how to use a defibrillator
