Sentence Starters

Ask your Year 4 child for examples of persuasive language and when this might be used.

Ask your Year 5 child to explain what the 4 processes of manufacturing are.

Ask your Year 6 child to tell you which biscuit is best for dunking and why?

Practise spellings in bursts of five minutes, and concentrate on one word a day as it's better to have one secure word than ten which will be forgotten the next day. At the end of the week, cement the words in the brain with a game such as snakes and ladders or speed spelling.

A reminder about earrings



Cambridge County Council has updated its safety guidance for schools with regard to wearing earrings whilst involved in physical activity.

All watches, jewellery and cultural or religious adornments must be removed for PE lessons.

This includes all earrings, studs and sleepers. If such items cannot be removed the individual is not prepared in an acceptably safe way and cannot continue as is, so must take part in modified activity. Care also must be exercised to ensure good hygiene is observed. Schools should not accept responsibility for removing or storing rings or studs used as adornment to body piercing. Items that are removed should not be stored communally to avoid contagion/infections.

Long hair must be tied back securely and fingernails should be appropriately short to prevent injury and applies to both boys and girls. Pupils must be dressed and shod in a manner which is appropriate to the activity and which allows full freedom of movement without any danger of snagging.



Click on the date you wish to book.



Step 4: Choose Teachers

If you chose the automatic booking mode, drag the sliders at the top of the screen to indicate the earliest and latest you can attend.

Select the teachers you'd like to book appointments with. A green tick indicates they're selected. To de-select, click on their name.

To add appointments for another child, press the Add Another Child button at the bottom and then repeat this step.

Step 5a (Automatic): Book Appointments

If you chose the automatic booking mode, you should see provisional appointments which are held for 2 minutes. To keep them, choose Accept at the bottom left.

If it wasn't possible to book every selected teacher during the times you are able to attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to meet with and try again, or switch to manual book-ing mode (Step 5b).

Step 5b (Manual): Book Appointments

Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signify where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable.

To change an appointment, delete the original by hovering over the blue box and clicking Delete. Then choose an alternate time.

After clicking on a green cell to make an appointment, a pop-up box appears where you can optionally leave a message for the teacher to say what you'd like to discuss or raise anything beforehand.

Once you're finished booking all appointments, at the top of the page in the alert box, press click here to finish the booking process.

Step 6: Finished

You're now on the My Bookings page and all your bookings are below. An email confirmation has been sent and you can also print appointments from this page by pressing Print.

To change your appointments, click on Amend Bookings.
