#### Attendance Monitoring—Further Clarification.

Last week we sent out attendance letters to inform parents and carers if their child's attendance had fallen below 96%. Following receipt of these letters we have been asked to provide some clarification about the attendance monitoring process.

Every month we analyse the attendance data for each child. The percentage attendance figure is calculated for the school year to the end of the previous month i.e. for this year this will be from 4th September 2023. Schools are required to ensure that parents are informed of any attendance concerns at an early stage and therefore you will receive an initial communication from us if your child's attendance falls below 96%.

This initial letter will be to simply make you aware of your child's attendance level. If concerns persist, then the school will contact you again to inform you of their concerns.

Following the initial letter, if your child's attendance level continues to fall we will contact you and can arrange a meeting with you to explore the reasons and discuss what help can be put in place to increase attendance.

The government now classes persistent absenteeism as 10%, which means that any child with an attendance of less than 90% will be classed as a persistent absentee and will be monitored by our Local Authority Attendance Improvement Officer. In these instances the Local Authority may issue a Penalty Notice. Please note that we are unable to authorise holidays or extended periods of leave during term time unless

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#### **Year 6 and the SAW Project**

This week we have been delighted to welcome the SAW project back to Monkfield Park. SAW or the Science Art and Writing initiative is a cross-disciplinary project that explores scientific themes through practical science activities underpinned by visually striking images. The images and science concepts are used as a creative stimulus for extension activities in art and writing. This innovative and inspirational project demonstrates so wonderfully how Science, art and creative writing overlap and interconnect. The amazing team from the John Innes Institute in Norwich allowed the children in Year 6 to see real, cutting edge science in the classroom, in addition to writing poetry with their resident poet and producing inspirational art with their resident artist. All the work is based on microbes and the incredible, microscopic world which is all around us. The children were able to experience the great beauty and benefits of the intriguing, invisible world that has such an impact on all our lives.



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#### **Salve Romans**

Year 4 have been immersing themselves in the Romans this term and celebrated the end of their topic with a WOW Day. As the Roman centurions and our resident Ancient Britons, led by our very own Queen Boudicca, marched through school we saw so much of the children's learning from their history topic coming to life. From making their very own replica shields, to mosaics, reconstructing an edible version of a Roman road, and learning how to read and write Roman numerals, the children were able to visualise what life was like for a Roman soldier living in the various outposts of the Roman empire at this time and what the Ancient Britons would have made of all the amazing new inventions such as heated houses! The children entertained us all in assembly on Friday with their rendition of the song 'Just Like a Roman' which included some amazing signing .
