## Mid-Term Reports and Parent Consultations

On Thursday 21st March the appointments will be virtual via zoom, again from 4.00 pm.

### **A Few Reminders**

The children are now accessing the field at lunchtimes all year round. This is to give them more room to run and play. ### Shapes Everywhere!

During our Group Time sessions this week, the Rabbit Group has started learning about shapes. We have looked at circles, triangles and semi-circles and talked about their properties. We have learnt the words 'corner' and 'side', looking to see how many each shape has, as well as 'straight' and 'curved' to describe the sides of different shapes. We went on a shape hunt around the classroom to find different objects and toys which are circles. We found out that there are circles EVERYWHERE! Maybe you could go on a shape search at home or when you are out and about? It would be great if you could upload some photos of your search on to Evidence Me for the children to share with their friends. Ask your child to describe the shapes to you, telling you how many corners and how many sides and whether the sides are straight or curved.



### World Book Day

Next Thursday 7th March is World Book Day. To mark this occasion, we would like to invite the children to dress up as a book character or to bring in an object to represent a favourite story. Costumes and accessories should be very simple and there is no need to purchase anything new. Children may also bring in their favourite book to share if they would like.
