Holidays in Term Time

Over the last few weeks we have seen a significant rise in the number of requests we are receiving for children to be taken out of school for family holidays in the coming weeks. We acknowledge the importance of family time and being able to relax together, however, the fact remains that we are unable to authorise holidays during term time except in very exceptional circumstances.

Did you know that there are only 190 statutory school days in one academic year? This means that the remaining 175 days (which are made up of weekends and school holidays) are available to use for holidays or leave. Every school day counts and when a child is absent from school, he or she misses important teaching. We want all our children to have the best start in life because we know that attending school is vital to a child's wellbeing, development, and attainment as well as impacting on future career success.

Please be aware that if children are taken on holiday or leave in term time, this will be counted as an unauthorised absence. This is the same as truancy and you may be at risk of a penalty notice fine being issued or prosecution in the Magistrates court.
