They girls played with great skill and team spirit to finish second in their group. Leila, in Year 6, was recognised by multiple schools for a 'spirit of the games' award for her teamwork and respect. Throughout the tournament Leila stood out for encouraging players from the other teams and

congratulating them all when they did well. Another local school only had 6 players on their team as a number of children dropped out. 



Black History Month


October is Black History Month and this has provided us with an opportunity to learn more about the black history, heritage, culture and achievements. This year the theme of Black History Month is on reclaiming narratives. This was defined in assembly as challenging misconceptions by sharing stories which may not be that well known. We heard the stories of people who had lived in Britain at different times in history and who all made contributions to life in this country. For example, how many people have heard of Olaudah Equiano who bought his freedom from slavery and became an author and key figure in the abolitionist movement in this country.?

Reception explored the vibrant story of Elmer, learning how we can celebrate our individuality and embrace our differences. Year 1 have been enjoying the book 'Martin's Big Words', discovering the dreams and aspirations of Martin Luther King Jr. Inspired by his message, they created their own project titled "My Own Big Words," sharing their hopes and dreams for the future. In Year 2, the children took a moment to express gratitude by writing thank you letters to Rosa Parks. They discussed her bravery and the importance of standing up for what is right, fostering a spirit of courage and respect in our community. Key Stage 2 children delved deeper into history, researching learning about the key themes of equality and segregation and discussed the impactful legacy of Marcus Rashford, exploring how one person's actions can inspire change. Year 5 took a unique approach by linking their studies to space! They wrote heartfelt letters to a younger version of Mae Jameson, the first black, female astronaut sharing how proud they were of her accomplishments and encouraging her to follow her dreams, despite the challenges she faced. Throughout the month, we've engaged in meaningful conversations and activities that celebrate our rich history and promote understanding and respect for all. Together, we have honoured

the past whilst looking forward to a brighter, more inclusive future where everyone is respected and valued.
